SEVEN LAST WORDS SERMON

This Thursday, March 21 Fr. Joseph Lee, FSSP, will come be present at ICC to give a Lenten Sermon on the Seven Last Words of Our Lord. It will begin just after the evening adoration at 7:00 pm. Fr. Lee is the Dean of Studies at OLGS and a fine preacher in the line of Fr. Goodwin and Fr. Buckley. Because of the talk, the Altar Society will not meet this month of March. Their next meeting will be April 11.

PALMS FOR PALM SUNDAY

There will not be a blessing of palms at the 7:00 am Mass on March 24. Those who attend this Mass will have to pick them up later that day or during the next week. They will be made available in the back of church following the blessing procession and Mass that will take place at 9:30 am that Sunday. The normal 10:00 am Mass is moved up one half hour that Sunday, because of the length of the ceremonies.

SOLEMN MASS FOR PALM SUNDAY MOVED TO 9:30 AM

The Palm Sunday liturgy involves the solemn blessing, distribution and procession with palms, along with the Passion according to St. Matthew. Because it will last a bit over two hours, the Mass will begin at 9:30 rather than 10:00 am.

HOLY WEEK CEREMONIES, DEVOTIONS AND CONFESSIONS

The full schedule for all Holy Week Ceremonies, Devotions and confession times can be found on the 2024 ICC Lenten Flyer which was published prior to Ash Wednesday. We have placed new copies of the flyer in the back of church for your convenience and it can be download on the ICC website. Please note that both priests will be participat-

ing in the liturgies of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. So, there will not be confessions available during those liturgies. Other hours for confessions are listed on the flyer. Please come and make good use of those hours for the Sacrament of Confession during Holy Week.

TENEBRAE

A word meaning "darkness" that is the title of the solemn chanting of Matins and Lauds for each day of the Sacred Triduum. It is the most sobering and penitential time of the Liturgical Year, a roughly two hour liturgy of meditations, psalms, and chants to help force us to focus on the deepest sentiments of the Sacred Heart of Our Suffering Redeemer. These are some of the most important liturgies of the year and a great help in making the most fruitful use of our time contemplating the Passion of Our Lord rather than letting the holiest week of the year pass by in vain amusements or solely in Easter Day preparations. You won't want to miss any of it. Please see the Lenten schedule for times.

RECEPTION AFTER THE EASTER VIGIL

We will have a small reception in the Gym late next Saturday following the Easter Vigil to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord. All who attend the Vigil are welcome to attend.
